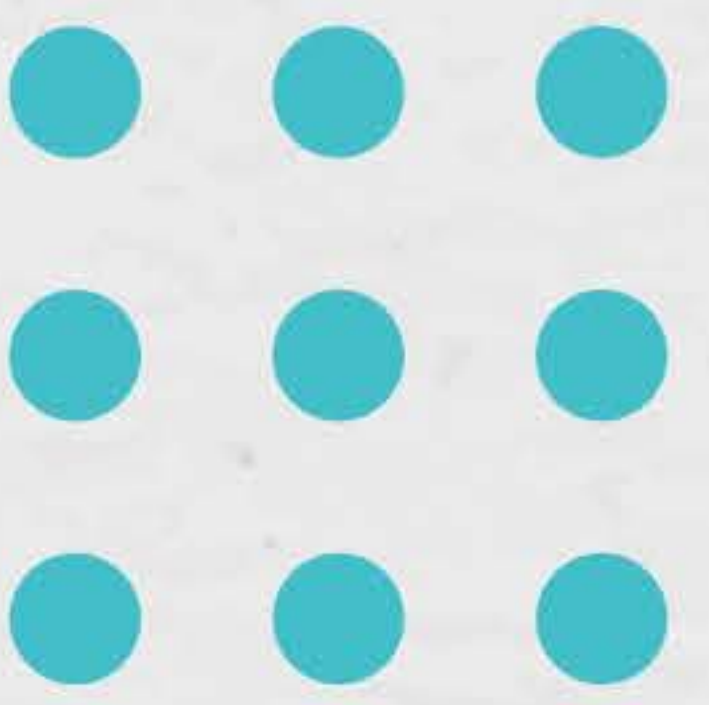




WHAT WE ENVISION

RECLAIMING LIVELIHOODS: NAZ BIBI'S RESILIENT COMEBACK

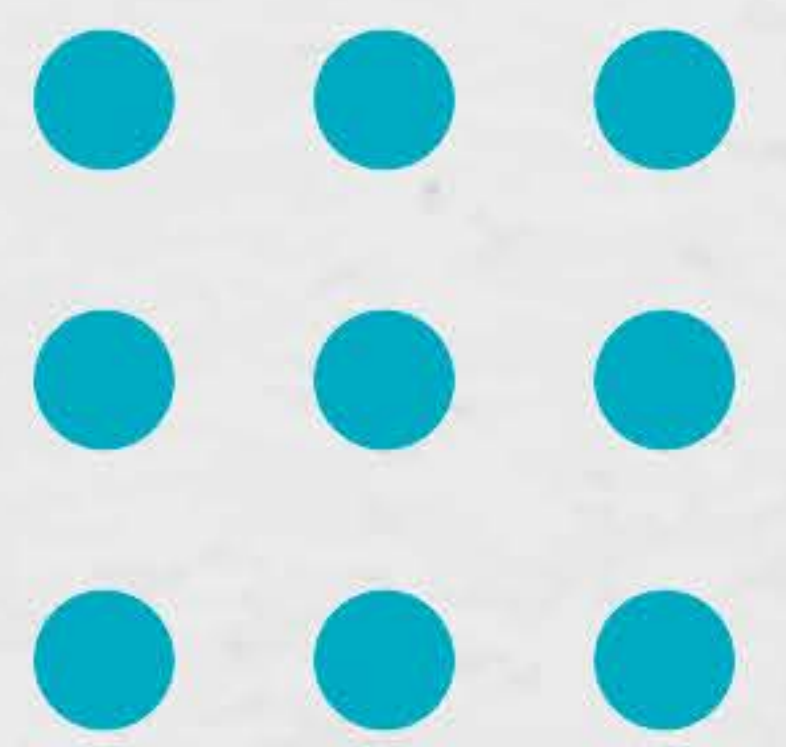
Before the floods, I had nothing left. Today, my children eat well, we share with others, and I have something to call my own again,"

STORIES OF CHANGE

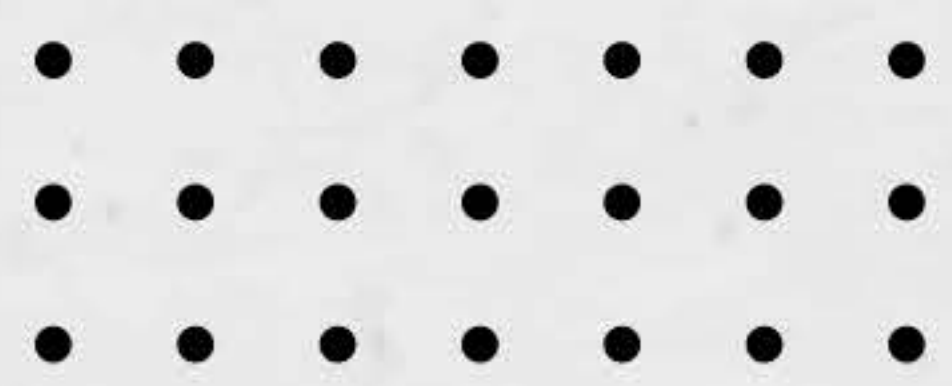


After the devastating 2022 floods, Naz Bibi, a mother of five from District Naseerabad, rebuilt her life through support from TKF and Oxfam's Agri-Input Livelihood Project. With a PKR 40,000 grant, she cultivated wheat and vegetables on a quarter acre of land, feeding her family and earning income by selling the surplus. Her recent sale of 25 kg of okra marked a turning point toward financial stability. Today, she stands as a symbol of resilience and empowerment, inspiring others in her community.



BREAKING BARRIERS TO EDUCATION: GUL SEEMA'S FIRST STEP

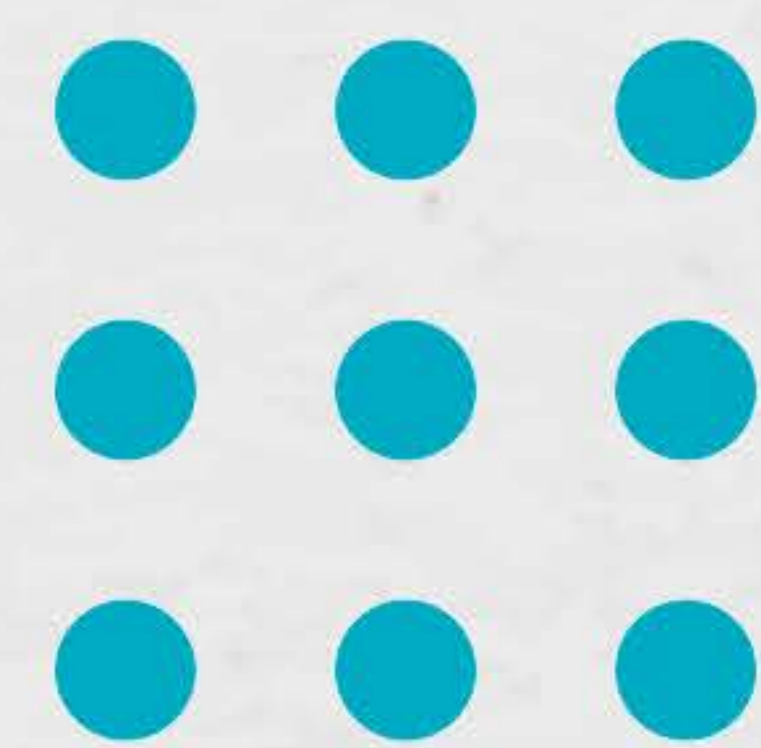
"I go to school every day with a big smile. I love reading English and want to be a doctor one day. I won't let my disability stop me from learning and reaching my dreams."

STORIES OF CHANGE

Gul Seema, an 8-year-old from Balochistan, dreamed of becoming a doctor but was denied admission to her village school due to a walking disability. Her father, a daily wager, couldn't afford private education. TKF's ERMP project team intervened, met with her family, and advocated for her inclusion at the local school. After persistent efforts, the school finally enrolled Gul. Now, she attends classes daily with excitement, and English is her favorite subject. Her story is a powerful reminder that determination and the right support can break down barriers to education.





A RAY OF HOPE: NOOR BIBI REBUILDS THROUGH ONION CULTIVATION

"The floods left us with nothing, and the hailstorms made it worse. When Citi Foundation and TKF chose our land for onion farming, it felt like a second chance. This crop could change our lives—and help other female farmers do the same."

STORIES OF CHANGE

After losing everything to the 2022 floods and a subsequent hailstorm, Noor Bibi and her husband from Balochistan were left in despair, struggling to feed their children and repay debts. Their fortunes began to shift when TKF and Citi Foundation selected their land for an onion cultivation initiative under a climate-resilient agriculture project. With seeds, training, and ongoing support, they began farming again—this time with renewed hope. Now just weeks away from harvest, Noor Bibi sees a pathway to stability, proving that with the right support, women farmers can lead their families out of crisis and toward recovery.
